Training Facility Features



Classroom: Prior to simulations, participants meet in the classroom to discuss the core content of the Blue Card Command program. Students also meet back in the classroom after each simulation to discuss the event in an informal and constructive environment.

Control Center: This room houses a console in which the operator can control all aspects of the scenario. This room also houses a working dispatch console which makes the scenario more realistic.



Command Vehicle: The command vehicle is an exact replica of the cab of a Battalion Chief vehicle. Once the initial arriving IC establishes command of the incident, the Battalion Chief will assume command. The vehicle contains tactical worksheets and is also designed to include an aide along with the Battalion Chief.



Company Officer Kiosks: These are individual work stations for each participant. Each console represents a different unit in the scenario ensuring that all participants communicate to effectively mitigate the incident.



CV-1: Once the incident expands beyond the command capabilities of the Incident Commander, he or she can move to the CV to form a complete command team.
